SERIES TITLE: DEEPER PART THREE: DEEP KNOWLEDGE TEXT: 1 JOHN 2:3-11

INTRODUCTION.

The series' theme comes from 1 John 2:24, "If what you heard from the beginning lives deeply in you, you will live deeply in both Son and Father." [The Message] We all want to be deep. We want something lasting, substantive, and profound. This study of 1 John calls us to deeply root ourselves in Jesus, in order to thrive in a fallen world.

DISCUSSION.

What is the difference between knowing someone with passing familiarity and knowing someone through intimate experience?

EXAMINATION.

2:1-6 When John talks about "we" to whom is he referring?

Isn't it unloving for John to use such strong language and call someone a "liar"? Why or why not?

What do you think it means for God's love to be made complete or perfect? (compare other places that word is used: 2 Cor. 12:9; Heb. 10:14; James 2:22; 1 John 4:17-18)

2:7-11 In what way is this not a new commandment but an old one (v.7); yet at the same time John says it is a new command (v.8)? What does he mean by that?

Although hate is a word that can include violence and even murder, John's concern about Christians hating each other can involve much less extreme behavior. (consider Luke 6:22; Luke 14:26; John 3:20; John 12:25) Based on these passages, what might hating other Christians look like?


Why does John equate love with living in the light, and how does that relate to not stumbling?

1) Obeying His Commands? 2)Loving His People?

- What does it look like to "walk as Jesus did"?
- Are there any parts of your job, or parenting, or daily life that you find it difficult to know what Jesus would do? Why?
- Why would loving others require choosing to be connected to others rather than isolated from them?
- Why does loving others require selflessness rather than self-centeredness?
- Why does loving others require choosing action over sentimentalism?
